

As for cake and dessert, Santa Lucia provides multiple selections available for the final course. A creamy white cheesecake topped with raspberries satisfies the sweet tooth almost too well, but if you go to a restaurant such as this, you need to try the ethnic desserts! The best in my book is the Kataifi, served with vanilla ice cream. Shredded phyllo dough, wrapped around cinnamon-glazed almonds and walnuts, and covered with a sweet honey sauce. At Santa Lucia, this dish is a flambé, meaning part of the cooking process is a table side fire. Our waiter brought it out, doused the dish with liquor, and set it ablaze. Not only did this provide entertainment for us (and the couple next to us), but it tasted heavenly.
